

Glossary

Article 2 of the Human Rights Center Rules

Human rights

The dignity, worth, and freedoms and rights as human beings guaranteed by the Constitution and laws of the Republic of Korea or recognized by international human rights treaties and customary international law to which the Republic of Korea is a party.

Human rights violations

Acts that violate human rights, including sexual harassment and sexual violence, or cause inconvenience or burden in exercising human rights.

Sexual harassment

Any behavior that causes another person to feel sexually humiliated, embarrassed or offended, regardless of whether a crime has been committed.

Sexual violence

Any act that violates the other person's right to sexual self-determination against their will as a criminal act of sexual violence under Article 2 of the 「Special Act on the Punishment of Sexual Violence Crimes」

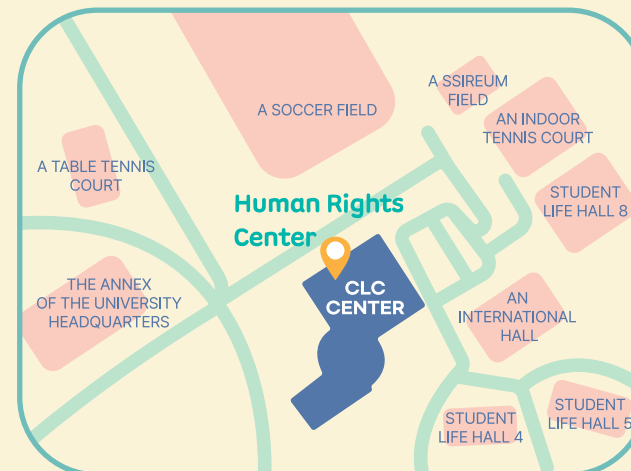

Report / counseling request

Phone or email

Intake interview

Decide whether to resolve the issue through reporting or counseling



03

Case investigation

- 3-1 Resolution and mediation between parties
- 3-2 Convene a deliberation committee and make a decision



04

Recommendation of remedies and measures

Notification of decision

Human Rights / Gender Equality Training

The Human Rights Center operates human rights / gender equality education, which is a compulsory legal education. All members of Hallym University must complete human rights / gender equality education at least once a year.

Completion method: attend violence prevention training on SmartLEAD and participate in some offline trainings.

Hallym Human Rights Center

Is a place to protect the human rights of members of Hallym University, to create a human rights-friendly, healthy university culture, and a safe campus.

Human Rights Violation, Sexual Harassment, and Sexual Violence Counseling, Investigations, and Eradication

Education for the prevention of human rights violations, sexual harassment and sexual violence

Respect for human rights, campaigns to spread gender-equal campus culture, and student participation activities

Surveys and related research to improve human rights awareness

Available Counseling Services

Human Rights Violations

Counseling for human rights concerns such as discrimination based on race, nationality, disability, and unfair treatment or violence due to hierarchical structures.

Sexual Harassment & Sexual Violence

Support for issues including sexual harassment (verbal, physical, visual), recovery from sexual violence, dating violence, illegal filming, stalking, and matters regarding sexual identity.

The specific interventions may vary based on the consultation details.

What kind of help can I get?

Preventive measures to mitigate further harm
e.g., physical separation, non-contact order

Victim recovery support
psychological support, trauma counseling, etc.

Assistance in case resolution
mediation, arbitration, disciplinary measures, alternative dispute resolution, etc.

Efforts to raise awareness among perpetrators and prevent recurrence
apologies, educational sessions, community service, etc.



Eligibility for Services

The Hallym Human Rights Center provides services to all members of Hallym University—students, faculty, and staff. Services are available to both victims and perpetrators as appropriate.
